Its primary function is to collaborate actively and in a spirit of mutual service with the parish priest in the development and planning of the pastoral care and apostolic effectiveness of the parish, including evangelical, catechetical and apostolic initiatives and the promotion of doctrinal formation and the sacramental life of the parish.
