Biography of Fr David-Mary McLean of the Order of Friars Preachers (OP)

Fr David was received into the church while at University of Edinburgh in 1984 and received the Dominican habit in 1987. While training for the priesthood with the Dominicans, he completed a Divinity degree at London and a master's degree in Medieval Theology at Oxford. Fr David was ordained to the priesthood in 1993 in London. For the three years after ordination, he fulfilled pastoral roles for the Dominicans, primarily at their large inner-city parish at St Dominic's Priory in London.

In 1996, Fr David joined the Royal Navy as a chaplain for what was expected to be a short period of time but is now retiring from the RN after 24 years. During that time: he has supported Land and Maritime Operations in Afghanistan and the Gulf; ships deployed in the Far East, the Caribbean, and the Mediterranean; and most UK RN shore bases.

On his retirement from the RN, Fr David will continue to reside at his house in Blackawton while renewing his academic interest through a part-time master's degree in Medieval Studies at the University of Exeter. While doing so, he has offered to support the Diocese of Plymouth, and Bishop Mark has therefore appointed him to Ivybridge given its reasonable proximity to Blackawton and Exeter.

The Presbytery News

When we discovered that Fr. David was not going to reside at the presbytery, the idea for possibility of letting it to assist with our financial position came from the diocese. We consulted the diocese, and with help from both Frs. David and Petroc, we investigated the idea. Everything then happened at great speed and before we had time to get under way, we were presented with prospective tenants who are friends of Dee Godfrey. We met with the husband and wife (they have 2 daughters aged 11 & 13) on a Saturday morning and they looked round and decided it was ideal for their requirements.

The following Monday I dropped in to see Veronica Beaver of the letting agents 'Your Home Let' in Glanvilles Mill. I asked her to do us a favour and visit the presbytery to give us a rental valuation. It turns out that she knew the story as the couple had told her over the weekend that they had found the presbytery and wanted to move. Not only are the couple existing tenants of the agency but the husband does a lot of the maintenance on the 150+ properties.

Fr. David then received a mail from the diocese giving lengthy advice on how to proceed. The first and most important advice was to use an agent – both to let the property and to manage the rental process. It seemed just 'right' to re-approach Veronica and ask her to handle it.

The requirements from us have been exhaustive with requests coming in from both the diocese and from the agency. We have been very busy and, at the moment of writing this, it looks as if the tenants will be moving in on the 1st October. They will have the presbytery (less the cellar) and the garage. They will have use of the garden area at the side of the presbytery and weekday use of the old tennis court. They will also be allocated 1 parking space outside the front of the presbytery.

I have deliberately left out all the details of the negotiation which would have taken this into a second – and possibly third – page.

However, I would like you all to know just how much additional and unexpected work has been put in by Hazel and particularly Pete Weardon. I would also like to thank Teresa for some excellent and unsolicited advice which helped with cross-referencing various requirements; and finally a big 'thank you' to Dee for introducing us to an ideal family.
